**Key Facts:** According to the 1991 Census there were just under a thousand children with a limiting long term illness resident in the East Riding of Yorkshire, representing less than 2% of all children in the authority. This figure is likely to understate the number of chronically sick or disabled children in the authority, as the data is now ten years old and is based on a self-assessment of long-term ill-health or disability. The wards are ranked according to the number of children with a positive response to the question below. Bridlington Old Town and South East Holderness ward ranked highest in the authority in terms of numbers. However, because numbers are small, differences between wards are unlikely to be statistically significant. See definitions for health warnings.
