Key Facts: One of the most important aspects of the quality of life is safety. Compared with the national average, the East Riding of Yorkshire has relatively low levels of crime. However, some areas of the authority suffer disproportionately from crime, most notably the urban areas of Beverley, Bridlington and Goole, as well as the residential area of Haltemprice. Overall, Bridlington continues to have the highest crime rate per capita in the authority, with rates nearly five times that of neighbouring Hornsea or Driffield. The highest crime rates in the Humberside Police Force area were recorded in the city of Hull.

NB. The population denominators used to calculate these rates are based on 1998 mid-year estimates. *hh.= households
