Key Facts

Educational qualifications play a key role in determining future life chances, affecting people's employment opportunities, income levels, housing and health. This indicator measures the degree of participation in further and higher education as well as the lack of formal qualifications amongst the local population. The larger the score the greater the degree of educational 'disadvantage' in the area. In the East Riding of Yorkshire, the highest scoring ward on this indicator was Boothferry West ward, followed by the wards of Bridlington and Goole town. Indeed, according to this measure, Boothferry West ward ranked amongst the top 20% most deprived wards in the country in terms of educational disadvantage.
