Key Facts: The death toll from all cancers is second only to that from circulatory diseases, accounting for 1 in 4 deaths in this authority. Nevertheless the death rate from cancer is lower than nationally, although rates vary for different types of cancer. For example, residents of this authority have a greater chance of dying of skin cancer than nationally and a smaller chance of dying of lung cancer. The table shows differences in death rates by electoral ward, with the highest rates observed in Goole, Bridlington Old Town and Boothferry West wards. However these differences are not statistically significant. See definitions for data sources and health warnings.
