Key Facts: National Performance Tables published by the DFEE can provide a crude snapshot of the exam performance of East Riding of Yorkshire pupils. The national target for 16 year-olds is 50% getting 5 A-C grades at GCSE and 95% getting at least 1 GCSE. According to these results, local pupils did better than average compared with other local authorities in the region. Indeed, East Riding of Yorkshire pupils are more likely to complete year 11 with at least one qualification than pupils nationally. See definitions for data sources and health warnings.
