Key Facts: This summary measure identifies wards which contain people whose quality of life is impaired by either poor health or disability. The higher the score the more health deprived the ward is. The wards shaded in grey rank amongst the top 20% most deprived wards in the country on this measure. It is not known how many people this summary measure applies to. However, benefits data gives some indication. According to the DSS, there were more than 8770 people claiming DLA in the authority, in May 1998, whilst 6479 were claiming SDA or IB. The wards with the highest number and proportion of claimants were Bridlington South, Bridlington Old Town, South East and South West Holderness and Goole. Indeed, according to this benefit data, more than 1 in 10 working age residents are claimants of Disability Living Allowance. See definitions.
