Key Facts: The overall index of multiple deprivation describes the wards by combining information from each of the six deprivation scores. The overall ward index is then ranked in the same way as other indices. The ward rank is the only way of comparing one ward score with another. The index does not represent a real value, for example, a percentage of the population. Thus one cannot say for example, that Bridlington South ward is four times as deprived as Cottingham South.
