Key Facts: According to government estimates, the 1991 Census undercounted more than 12,500 residents, or an estimated 5% of the population. Drypool, Pickering and Derringham wards grew in size between 1991-98, reflecting recent housing developments in the area. However, overall the trend is downwards, with the latest mid-year estimates for 1999 suggesting a further fall in the resident population since 1998 to 257,900, a much steeper decline than that suggested by local NHS registrations. Areas with large public housing estates, such as Noddle Hill and Orchard Park experienced the sharpest falls in population. By 2021, the ONS estimates suggest that the total resident population will have grown 14 % to a total of 293,600. This assumes a 42% growth in the number of 45-64 year olds in the area between 1996-2021. The greatest declines are expected amongst the under 16s. However, national projections suggest that dependent children will still outnumber resident pensioners in this authority by the year 2021. See definitions for data sources and health warnings.
