Key Facts: Exclusion from employment is acknowledged to be one of the main causes of poverty and social exclusion in this country. People who are not in work are more likely to suffer ill-health, anxiety and depression and are more likely to die prematurely. Children who live in workless households are less likely to eat a healthy diet, are more likely to smoke in later life and are more likely to suffer from accidental injuries, (DSS, 1999). The total number of people excluded from employment through sickness, illness, disability or unemployment is estimated to be in the region of 25,437 in this authority, or roughly 15% of the population of working age. This figure far exceeds the official unemployed claimant count, which excludes people excluded from work as a result of ill- health, disability or caring responsibilities. The highest rates were found in the Myton, Orchard Park, Marfleet and Noddle Hill. Those wards shaded in grey rank amongst the top 20% most deprived wards in the country on this measure.
